EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

BCW and Prime Policy Group are pleased to present our Election 2020 Viewing Guide - a stateby-state, play-by-play resource that cuts to the critical information for following one of the most historic elections in U.S. history.

The 2020 election—culminating on November 3—is the 59th occasion that Americans cast ballots to determine the election of the president and vice president of the United States. Also featured on the ballot are majority control of the U.S. Senate and House of Representatives and nearly 6,000 state races, the outcomes of which will influence the composition of congressional districts for the next decade.

The environment in which this election has progressed is unprecedented. Our country is confronted with the COVID-19 pandemic, economic uncertainty, civil unrest and anguish, debilitating natural disasters and the constant struggle to contain foreign interference in our democratic institutions. These challenges have added unfamiliar and extraordinary dimensions to one of the most incomparable elections in modern American history.

What's at stake is also historic. The outcomes from this election will shape some of the most significant policy debates of our generation: reforms to the tax code, the accessibility of economic opportunity, environmental justice, the role of the U.S. in the world, health care, racial justice and equality, immigration and manufacturing, just to name a few. Passions are high throughout the county, and the days following November 3 may be confusing to some and exasperating to many. The expected record voter turnout, coupled with the prevalence of mail-in voting, increase the chance that we may not know the winner of the presidential election on election night.

In chronological order of poll closings, the Election 2020 Viewing Guide walks through election night as it unfolds, providing key information and insights for each state—bellwether areas to watch, key races in play and timing for processing mail-in ballots that will help forecast which states may be delayed in reporting results. Its intent is to help synthesize what you need to know and when, so you can track and analyze in real-time both the developments and what's at stake.

VOTE TRACKING CONSIDERATIONS



Pace of Tabulation Will Vary

States with longer pre-processing times for mail-in ballots (e.g. AZ, FL, NC) may be better equipped to deliver results more quickly on election night; states like PA and WI, which cannot begin processing until Election Day, may lag.



Beware of Misleading Early/Late Results

States do not report votes in a uniform fashion; those reporting mail-in ballots first may skew the initial tally toward Democrats, while Republicans may get an early jump in states that initially report rural or in-person vote totals.




Projections vs. Certifications

While news organizations will project winners of various races and states to the extent the data allows, the results are not official until certified by state officials in the weeks following Election Day; a candidate's claim of victory does not make it so.







Bellwethers

- Pinellas County: One of the swingiest of swing counties in the swingiest of swing regions (the I-4 corridor)
- Collier County: Trump won this county in 2016, but it has a large percentage of college educated voters. If Democrats are doing well with this group, as polling suggests, it will show up here
- Seminole County: Long a Republican stronghold, Seminole is the only county in the urban core of Orlando that Clinton didn't win in 2016
- The Panhandle: Republicans will look to stockpile votes in these (mostly) very red counties

 - Warnock (D) vs. Loeffler (R) vs. Collins (R) vs. The Field: The special election to determine who will fill the last two years of former Sen. Johnny Isakson's term is headed for a run-off; Rev. Raphael Warnock (D) will likely fill one of the spots with the other likely to be filled by either Sen. Kelly Loeffler or Rep. Doug Collins, both Republicans

House:

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
- GA-6: Republicans are looking to flip this district back into their control after a 2018 mid-term defeat
- GA-7: Democrats' came within 433 votes of defeating an incumbent in 2018 and are now trying to flip this open seat
- Georgia State House and Senate: Control of both chambers is up for grabs, and Democrats will be trying to flip enough seats in one – most likely the Senate – to break Republicans' trifecta

Bellwethers

- Gwinnett and Cobb Counties: Once traditional Republican strongholds, these are quickly diversifying suburban counties where Democrats are looking to echo their 2018 successes
- Peach County: One of the few swing counties in the state, Democrats will need Black voters to turn out in Obama-era levels if they want to win

- Senate: Perhaps the most surprisingly competitive Senate race this election cycle, Sen. Lindsay Graham (R) is attempting to hold off Jaime Harrison (D), who has smashed Senate fundraising records
- SC-1: Republicans are looking to flip this district back into their control after a 2018 defeat, though Rep. Joe Cunningham has shown surprising strength and is favored to keep it
- SC State Senate: Control of the State Senate is potentially up for grabs, with Democrats attempting to flip 4 seats in Charleston County to bring control of the body to a 23-23 tie

Bellwethers

- Atlantic Coast: This part of the state, which includes population-heavy Charleston County, will be pivotal in both the Senate race and the only competitive House race.
- Charlotte suburbs: The fast-growing metropolitan area crosses over the NC-SC border to include Chester, Lancaster and York counties in South Carolina.
 Democratic candidates will be looking to see if this area follows the voting patterns of similar suburban areas.



- Robeson County: Historically a Democratic stronghold, Trump won this county in 2016

Key Races

- Senate: Sen. Thom Tillis (R) is looking to keep this seat, but has faced a tough challenge from Democrat Cal Cunningham, who has found himself embroiled in a personal scandal; the race is considered a toss-up
- House: Two seats, NC-02 and NC-06, are likely
 Democratic flips because of court-ordered redistricting
 - NC-08: Perhaps the most competitive in the state, Rep. Richard Hudson is attempting to fend off Pat Timmons-Goodson in this central North Carolina district
- North Carolina House: Like the federal election map, the state House district map has been redrawn for 2020. In order to take control of the body, Democrats will need to pick up 6 seats (5 seats to be in a tie for control).

- Northwest Ohio: Counties like Lucas, Erie, Ottawa and Wood, Sandusky and Stark will prove critical; many of these are Obama > Trump counties that Biden will look to recapture

Bellwethers

 Kansas City and Topeka Suburbs: Democrats will look to maintain the gains they made here in 2018 that helped them win the gubernatorial race. This area is key to both the Senate race, as well as two House races.

Key Races

- Senate: With Sen. Pat Roberts' (R) retirement, Kansas Republicans are attempting to maintain control of this seat - Democrats haven't won a Senate race in the state since 1932. Rep. Roger Marshall (R) is facing Barbara Bollier, a Democratic state senator.
- KS-02: First-term congressman Steve Watkins (R) lost his primary to Jake LaTurner, who will now face Michelle De La Isla, the Mayor of Topeka; this race is considered a toss-up
- KS-03: Rep. Sharice Davids (D) seems to have solidified control over this seat that she won in 2018, but Republicans remain bullish

- ME-02: Rep. Jared Golden (D) is attempting to win a second term in this district that President Trump won in 2020.
- State House and Senate: Maine is the only opportunity that Republicans have in 2020 to break a Democratic trifecta, although it is unlikely

- MI-03: Rep. Justin Amash's decision not to seek another term has resulted in this race being a toss-up; Peter Meijer (R) is facing Hillary Scholten (D)
- MI-06: Long-serving Rep. Fred Upton (R) is facing a tough reelection in this southwestern Michigan district against Jon Hoadley (D)
- Michigan State House: Democrats are attempting to flip four seats for control of the chamber

Bellwethers

- Macomb County: A suburb of Detroit, it is one of the many Obama > Trump counties across the Midwest. If Biden is improving upon Clinton's numbers in suburban districts, it may show up here
- Kent County: Long a Republican stronghold, Democrats have a reasonable chance to flip the Grand Rapids-area this year; Trump carried it with fewer votes than Mitt Romney in 2012
- Western Michigan: While Trump is likely to carry the region, Democrats hope to build upon inroads made here in recent years
- Flint: Democrats will need to improve turnout in cities like Flint; while Clinton won the region, significantly fewer people voted for her than President Obama four vears earlier

- Tarrant County: Home to Fort Worth, the county went blue in 2018 and will be a major battleground for the both federal and state races
- Houston Area: Harris and Fort Bend Counties both voted for Clinton in 2016 and offer Democrats the opportunity to pick up votes to offset Trump's strength in rural areas
- Rio Grande Valley: The southern tip of Texas voted heavily for Clinton in 2016 but Republicans believe they have opportunities to get votes from more socially conservative Hispanics here
- The Panhandle: The friendliest region to Trump, he will seek to stockpile votes in areas like Coke, Howard, Scurry and Wheeler Counties in order to offset losses elsewhere

Key Races

- Senate: Majority Whip John Cornyn (R) is seeking a fourth term against MJ Hegar; the race has tightened considerably, but Cornyn is a slight favorite to win






